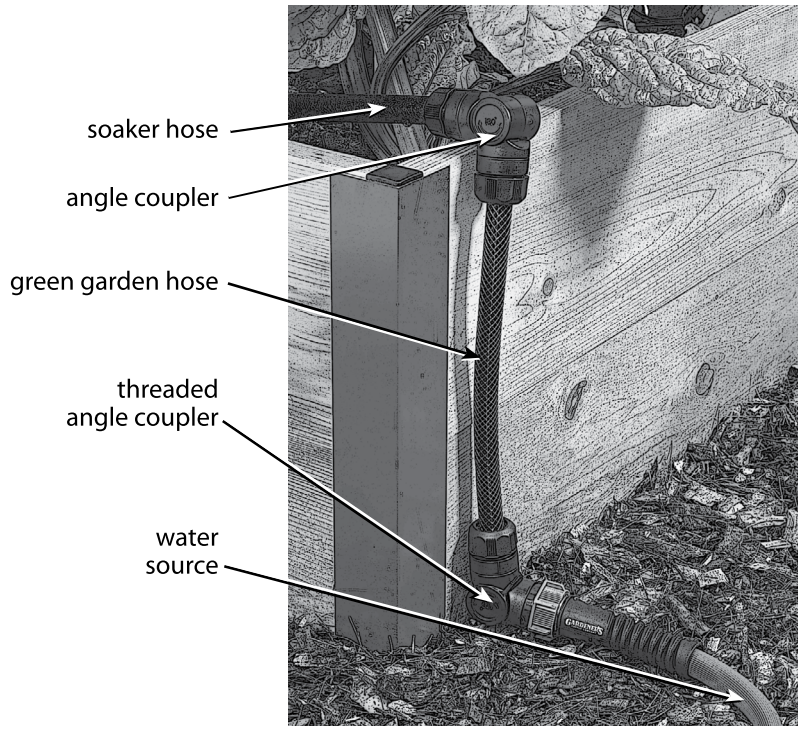


Snip·n·Drip

raised bed soaker system

Drought-proof your raised bed! The innovative Snip-n-Drip is so easy to set up, and you can leave it in place for convenient watering all season long. Adjusts to fit raised beds from 6" to 48" high.



Assembly

- 1. Prepare the hoses.** Unroll the black soaker hose and green garden hose and lay them in the sun to increase flexibility.
- 2. Attach the threaded angle coupler to the 48" green garden hose.** Unscrew the threaded cap from the rounded end of the coupler and slide the cap over one end of the hose. Push the end of the hose firmly into the exposed end of the coupler until it stops. Slide the cap over the threads of the coupler and screw it firmly into place. Bend the coupler to a 90-degree angle and place it at the base of your raised bed.
- 3. Cut the green garden hose to fit your raised bed height.** Extend the green hose to the top of the bed, and then cut it about an inch longer to allow for insertion into the coupler. Attach the angle coupler to the cut end of the green hose, following instructions in step 2.
- 4. Attach the black soaker hose to the other side of the angle coupler** at the top of the raised bed.
- 5. Lay out the black soaker hose in your raised bed.** Use an S- or U-shape to ensure uniform water distribution. Cut to length, if necessary.
- 6. Attach the end cap to the end of the soaker hose,** following instructions in step 2.
- 7. Attach the threaded angle coupler to a water source.** Thread your garden hose onto the angle coupler at the bottom of the raised bed. Attach your garden hose to a faucet and you're done!

Tips for Use

- Hold the soaker hose and fittings in place with optional Earth Staples or Easy Out Earth Staples.
- Adjust the water pressure at the faucet so that the water drips from the soaker hose without spraying.
- Drain the soaker system prior to freezing weather to prevent hose splitting. The system may be left in place for the winter after draining.
- Add a water timer to automatically water your raised bed.

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
